

SYDNEY WATER BUIDLING PLAN APPROVAL PROCESS

If you are developing, building, or renovating in Sydney it is more than likely that you will need Sydney Water certification and/or approval.

It is also likely that your proposed design may impact Sydney Water assets, as you maybe building close or over Sydney Water assets. This could impact your proposed design and add to your client's budget.
